

Appendix 1.C Decision-Making Scenarios

1. Your class has an opportunity for a class trip to Neptune Theater. The Theater has agreed to provide a backstage tour and opportunities to interview the actors and production staff. They will provide lunch, but the class will have to purchase tickets to the play at \$20 each (half price). The school agrees to pay for the bus. You are the chairperson of a three-person committee organized to hold a fundraiser. You collect enough money for half the cost of the tickets. That means that each student will have to pay \$10. You overhear three students talking; they are all from families who are having a hard time financially. They will not be able to go because they cannot pay the \$10, and they are disappointed and embarrassed.

What options do you and your committee have?

2. You have a part time job at a convenience store. A friend comes in and asks for bread and milk on credit. You know the family is struggling, but the boss has said that he has a no-credit policy.

What are your options?

3. You are new on the job at the lumberyard. Your friend got you the job, and she is your supervisor. She asks you to stand on the forklift to steady the load of paint while she moves it onto a truck. You know that this is an unsafe practice. Your friend promises to be careful and go slowly. The load shifts and falls and the cans of paint burst open. You are unhurt but covered with paint.

What options does your friend have? What options do you have?
